Golden Rule Peace Boat coming to Hartford and Middletown



Golden Rule, a Project of Veterans for Peace, will be in Central Connecticut Historic Sailboat Project Supports UN Treaty to Ban Nuclear Weapons

In 1958 four Quaker peace activists sailed the Golden Rule toward the Marshall Islands in an attempt to halt nuclear weapons testing. The US Coast Guard boarded her in Honolulu and arrested her crew, causing an international outcry. Arrest of the crew and rising awareness of the dangers of radiation led to worldwide demands to stop nuclear testing. This spurred the U.S., the U.S.S.R., and the U.K. to sign the Limited Nuclear Test Ban Treaty of 1963. In 2010, the Golden Rule was rebuilt in Humboldt Bay, Northern California and is now, "Sailing for a Nuclear Free World and a Peaceful, Sustainable Future."

From 2015 - 2022, the Golden Rule sailed the West Coast between British Columbia and San Diego and to Hawai'i and back.

The Golden Rule Project has given hundreds of educational presentations about nuclear issues and led many peace flotillas. Thousands of people visited the Golden Rule during four wooden boat shows. With tensions so high between nuclear armed nations, it is more important than ever to bring a message of peace.
